Scripture Reading:

Hebrews 8-10

Lesson Questions:

1. What is a covenant, where are they present in our lives, and what expectations do they add to our relationships? (Hebrews 8)
2. What does God's new covenant offer that His old covenant does not? (Hebrews 8)
3. How does the new covenant give you hope or help today, and who around you needs to hear what you are learning? (Hebrews 8)
4. Describe the limits, or what is lacking, in the first covenant and earthly sanctuary? (Hebrews 9:1-10)
5. How can we best understand God's requirement for shed blood to forgive people's sins (Hebrews 9:7)? (See also: Leviticus 16:11, 17:11, Hebrews 5:3, 9:22)
6. When we struggle with guilt, why is Christ's sacrifice such encouraging good news (Hebrews 9:8-10)?
7. What did Jesus Christ secure by His sacrifice, and why is this work important? (Hebrews 9:11-28)
8. What is your personal response to Jesus Christ's sacrifice? (Hebrews 9:11-28)
9. How does Jesus offer the new covenant, and how is it received? (Hebrews 9:11-28)
10. What stands out about Jesus and His sacrifice in comparison to the sacrifices made by the priests? (Hebrews 10)
11. How do verses 19-39 describe what perseverance during hardship looks like? (Hebrews 10)
12. What warning, challenge, or encouragement is most relevant to your life now? (Hebrews 10)
13. How did this week's study impact your thinking about God's intentions and His covenants? (Review)
14. How did these chapters give you hope for the unbelievers you know? (Review)
15. What instances of God's goodness have you observed or experienced this week? (Reflect)
16. What from this week's verses, study or discussion would you most like to put into action, and how will you do so? (Reflect)
