1. What is faith, and how does its description in this chapter differ from ways some people think of it today (See John 3:16, 6:29, Romans 4:16-17, 23-24 to learn more about faith.)? (Hebrews 11:1-16)
2. How do the ways people in this passage viewed life and God's promises relate to your outlook and experiences? (Hebrews 11:1-16)
3. Which of these verses encourage you to persevere in faith, and how could you turn the verses into a prayer? (Hebrews 11:1-16)
4. Which examples of living by faith stand out, and why? (Hebrews 11:17-40)
5. What inspiring, challenging or surprising lessons about faith immediately apply to your circumstances? (Hebrews 11:17-40)
6. How is God leading you to live out your faith in Jesus Christ, especially in time of testing? (Hebrews 11:17-40)
7. What help to persevere in faith is found in Hebrews 12:1-3?
8. What is true about God's discipline and how do these truths connect to your current circumstances? (Hebrews 12)
9. How is Jesus described in this chapter, and how are you choosing to respond to Him? (Hebrews 12)
10. What practical ways to live out faith are given? (Hebrews 13)
11. Which of these ways will you commit to practice in your home, church, workplace, or community, and what might result from your action? (Hebrews 13)
12. Why is it hard to practice faith, and how does Jesus' example of faithfulness encourage you? (Hebrews 13)
13. How does this week's study affect your understanding of faith, hope, and love? (Review)
14. How do these chapters help you connect your faith experience with the past and the future? (Review)
15. What are some truths you have learned about God, yourself and God's plan for you during our "WordGo" study of Hebrews? (Reflect)
16. What experiences of God's work in your life this week or during our study do you want to remember and share with others? Who might need to hear your story to be encouraged to trust Jesus at this time? (Reflect)
